Southeast Water Reliability Project **PHASE 1**

The Southeast Water Reliability Project (SWRP) will be constructed in two phases. Phase 1 of SWRP will be approximately 6.7 miles of recycled water pipeline that will run through the cities of Pico Rivera and Montebello.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the benefits of this project?

Once completed, Phase 1 of SWRP will carry approximately 326 million gallons of recycled water for non-potable use across 6.7 miles of pipeline. Increasing the use of recycled water for industrial and irrigation purposes will help drought-proof the region by conserving precious drinking water for future use. Conservation at this level will help Central Basin's 24 cities meet the aggressive California state mandate that requires a 20% reduction in urban water use by the year 2020. Construction of Phase 1 will also bring federal stimulus funding to the region and create hundreds of new jobs.

How will I be impacted during the pipeline construction?

While every effort will be made to minimize inconvenience for those who live and work along the alignment, during construction, it is expected that noise, construction traffic and related activities will temporarily impact businesses and residents in the area. Businesses and residents will be notified of any construction impacts in advance through construction notices and street signage.

How do I get information about construction?

Prior to construction, notices will be provided to businesses and residents as construction occurs along the alignment and as neighborhoods are impacted.

A live-answer information hotline has also been established and is available Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Calls placed after regular working hours can access detailed construction and traffic information through the message menu. 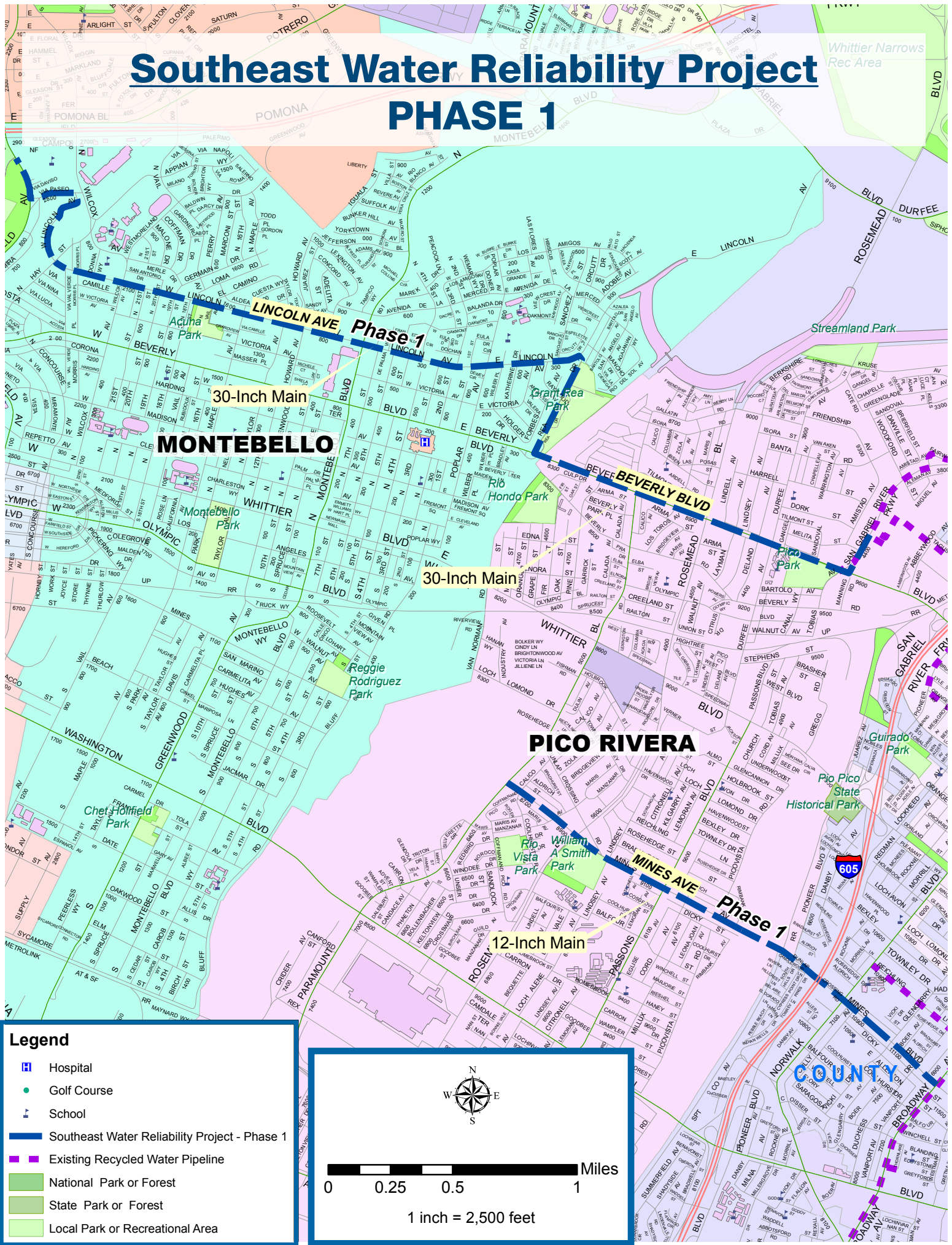
