INFORMATION CALENDAR

WATERFREE URINAL PROGRAM UPDATESUMMARY:

The participation level for this Program continues to increase. To date, over 1,000 devices have been installed at various locations throughout the District. The goal is to install 2,600 devices by April 15, 2006.

Division I – Director Vasquez

- A meeting was held with the Montebello Unified School District. The School District has agreed to install the devices at one or two schools for testing purposes. The District's vendor, Falcon Waterfree Technologies, is currently working with the school District to install the devices.
- Currently installing 18 devices at various sites in the City of Bell Gardens. The sites include: City Hall, the Police and Fire Departments, and various parks.
- Installed 12 devices at Montebello Christian School.
- Installed two devices at Norwalk City Hall for testing purposes and have a potential for 12 more at various City locations.

Division II – Director Apodaca

- El Rancho Unified School District has installed 110 devices at various schools.
- Whittier Unified School District has installed two devices at Los Nietos School for testing purposes with a potential for 50 more.
- The Aquatic Park in the City of Whittier is currently doing a pilot with eight (8) devices.
- Whittier City School District installed 60 devices at 13 different schools.
- Installed four devices at Trojan Battery in Santa Fe Springs, with a potential for 25 more.
- Installed 12 devices at Fortune Fashions in Vernon, with a potential for 18 more.

Division III – Director Cole

- Installed four (4) devices at Graphic Press in the City of Commerce.
- Installed six (6) devices at the City Yard in Huntington Park.
- The City of Bell is testing two (2) devices, with the potential for 40 more.

Division IV – Director Gonzalez

- Installed three (3) devices at Team Challenge in South Gate.

Division V – Director Hawkins

- Currently working with ABC School District to install devices at schools in Artesia and elsewhere.
- Installed three (3) devices at the City of Cerritos for testing purposes, with a potential for 35 more at various locations.

Staff will continue to report the activity, successes, and challenges of the Program.
