Chapter 8 Integrated Regional Water Management Program (IRWMP)

Staff has been participating in the development of an IRWMP led by the Watershed Conservation Authority, a Joint Powers Authority between the Rivers and Mountains Conservancy (RMC) and the County. The regional group has developed a tiered "suite of projects" in which both of the District's projects are ranked at the top of the list. Central Basin is requesting \$1.2 million for the Large Landscape Conservation/Runoff Reduction Management Program and \$7.6 million for the Southeast Water Reliability Project, Phase I. There are a total of ten projects that the regional group has ranked as Tier I, with a total request of \$47 million. Exhibit "A" lists all of the projects received and ranked by the stakeholders. The County submitted a Planning grant application in May and an Implementation grant application in July. There is \$160 million in this funding cycle and \$220 million in next year's funding cycle that will be distributed by the joint administering agencies: the Department of Water Resources and the State Water Resources Control Board. There is a \$500,000 maximum award for a planning grant and \$50 million maximum award for an implementation grant.
