## HELP CONSERVE LOS ANGELES COUNTY'S WATER SUPPLY WHILE REDUCING YOUR BUILDING'S OPERATING COSTS

The Central Basin Municipal Water District (CBMWD) is offering a program to cover the complete cost of replacing water-using urinals with waterfree urinals. Replacing a high-water-using urinal with a waterfree fixture will save approximately 40,000 gallons of water annually.

### WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

The CBMWD Waterfree Urinal Program is open to commercial, industrial, and institutional (CII) building owners in the District's 24 member cities on a first come, first served basis.

### ALL REPLACEMENT COSTS ARE COVERED

Qualifying participants in the CBMWD program will receive a free waterfree urinal installed in place of each existing manual or automatic flush urinal. The program covers the cost of the waterfree urinal, normal installation, and training for maintenance personnel. With typical existing

plumbing, there will be no out-of-pocket expense for program participants.\* Urinal retrofits are typically completed in approximately two to three hours with minimal disruption of the customer's restroom facilities.

### HOW TO PARTICIPATE

It's easy to take advantage of CBMWD's Waterfree Urinal Program.

1. Contact the program contractor, Falcon Waterfree Technologies, at 1-866-275-3718.
2. Participate in a brief pre-installation survey to assess current fixture usage rates and water consumption, and determine retrofit requirements. If necessary, you will be supplied with an estimate for any installation charges not covered by the program.
3. Schedule an installation date.
4. Make maintenance personnel available for a brief training session.
5. Agree to participate in periodic site inspections to assure proper maintenance is being performed.
6. Allow time for a brief final interview to provide details of your experience with the fixtures as part of the final report to be completed for the California Department of Water Resources.

*\*Participating customers who have floor-mounted units, code violations in plumbing systems, or with installations that require repair of wall coverings, will be responsible for additional installation costs.*

### WHO IS CBMWD?

Formed in 1952, Central Basin is a public agency that wholesales imported water to cities, mutual water companies, investor-owned utilities and private companies in southeast Los Angeles County. Today, Central Basin serves a population of more than 1.5 million in its 227-square mile service area consisting of 24 cities and unincorporated County areas. Along with its innovative conservation programs, Central Basin works diligently to drought-proof the region by providing recycled water for municipal, commercial and industrial uses. Ensuring a reliable high-quality water supply for the present and future is Central Basin's commitment to the public.
